Department of Education Guidance

The 16 to 19 tuition fund is a one-off fund for the 2021 to 2022 academic year only. It is ring fenced funding for schools, colleges and all other 16 to 19 providers to support small group tuition for 16 to 19 students in English, maths, and other subjects where learning has been disrupted, including vocational and/or academic learning.

Although the actual tuition does not need to be for GCSE English or Maths, the students supported all need to be those who had not achieved grade 4 or above in at least one of those subjects at this level by age 16 or come from an economically deprived area (defined as students from the 27% most deprived areas on the index of multiple deprivation).

All supported students must be on a 16 to 19 study programme in 2020 to 2021 academic year. You should have regard to the needs of students with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND), particularly where they have experienced additional disruption to learning as a result of their specific needs and disabilities. At a post-16 level it is targeted approaches that should be used to accelerate learning.

English resit October half-term intensive catch-up (51 students)	Students below a 4 in English targeted. Small groups (no more than 5) given 6 hours of intensive GCSE English revision and support over half-term to help them achieve a grade 4 in their upcoming resit.	12/13	£3,300
Maths resit October half-term intensive catch-up (63 students)	Students below a 4 in Maths targeted. Small groups (no more than 5) given 6 hours of intensive GCSE Maths revision and support over half-term to help them achieve a grade 4 in their upcoming resit.	12/13	£3,900
Additional Literacy support for all Level 2 Pathway students	20 students studying Level 2 courses (without a 4 in English) would receive an hour literacy tuition and support for 14 weeks. This would help them to get the necessary literacy support to succeed on their L2 courses, address Covid-deficits and to pass the year and progress onto the Level 3 pathway.	12	£2,800
Online tutoring support for L2/3 subjects for all students without a 4 in Maths and/or English	Students will be triaged according to need and size of Covid-deficit from last year. Approximately 15 students will receive a 10 week programme of online tutoring (for example from MyTutor)	12/13	£3,150
