# What can you study?

We offer a range of A Level and BTEC Level 3 courses. Standard minimum entry requirement is five grades of 4-9 or equivalent, which must include Maths and English. Equivalent BTEC qualifications are also acceptable and could be an advantage for students wishing to go onto our Level 3 BTEC courses. If you meet these requirements but narrowly miss out on your Grade 4 English Language or Mathematics, we will work with you to help you get there in Year 12. For students that don't meet the entry criteria for our Level 3 courses, we offer a Level 2 pathway. This acts as

a foundation year, where you will study two Level 2 courses with a view to graduating from this to studying these at Level 3 the following year. If you think this might be of interest to you, please speak to us about your individual situation to see what your options are.

Full details are available on the Sixth Form Section of the website under the heading Sixth Form Subjects. All courses have individual entry requirements which are explained here. The majority of

students will take three subjects throughout their two-year course. Students who are at, or near, the minimum entry level would be advised to consider the BTEC courses which are often more accessible and involve more coursework than their A Level counterparts. Students may also combine a mixture of BTEC and A Level subjects. Students who have eight or more GCSE passes at Grades 7-9 might want to consider taking a fourth subject. Whatever you choose, you will be supported to succeed in your chosen subjects. We look forward to working with you!



# Performing Arts

We believe in the Performing Arts and want to give our students the best possible opportunity to succeed in the industry. We offer an amazing suite of post-16 courses that are both practical and industry related. Our Cambridge Technical courses offer students the opportunity to develop their technical skills, while testing their academic abilities and preparing them for the world of work in the Performing Arts.

Our courses cover 5 disciplines, Acting, Music, Dance, Musical Theatre and Technical Theatre and two sizes of qualification. You can opt to study Performing Arts as a single option alongside two other A-Levels or take the extended course, which is a full-time, two-year course that is the equivalent of 3 A-Levels. Please note that Musical Theatre is only available on the Extended Diploma.

You will be provided with a 1-2-1 coaching session each week on your chosen discipline and will undertake regular performance development sessions, following a skills development programme to make you a stronger performer. If you follow the Technical Theatre pathway, where other pathways 'perform', you will work in a technical capacity, learning how to design and run the sound, lighting, scenery and backstage management you will need to ensure your fellow students' performances are all they can be. The technical course blends the creativity of design ideas with the technical skills to put the ideas into practice.

The course will involve lots of work outside the classroom, including visits to Performing Arts venues, visits to performances, running workshops in local schools and plenty of performing opportunities. The course is open to any genre of performance, allowing rock and pop musicians to study alongside classical performers, lighting designers to work with actors, and street dancers to develop their skills on the same course as ballet dancer.

# Basketball

As regular qualifiers for national championship events, HTS used its strong national league club links to set up its Elite Basketball Academy. Originally set up as a non-qualification venture where students could develop their skills alongside their academic and vocational qualifications, we have now developed a range of Level 2 and 3 sports options that can be followed as one option or indeed as a

full extended programme. With an expanded coaching team the programme has gone from strength to strength and we have now won multiple national honours. Regular court time alongside our strength and conditioning programme means we offer an exciting range of opportunities and success for our student athletes.



# Crawley Town Education Academy

The Crawley Town Foundation Academy is a collaboration between Crawley Town FC, Crawley Town Community Foundation, and The Holy Trinity Sixth Form. Students between the ages of 16 and 19 have the opportunity to gain a university accredited qualification whilst being part of an extensive professional football programme, completing the BTEC Level 3 Extended Diploma in Sport (equivalent to three A-Levels).

All education is delivered on-site at the Broadfield Stadium and provided by Crawley Town's fully qualified teachers who have extensive employment history in sport/football, as well as holding coaching qualifications. Alongside their academic programme, football

students train between 6-8 hours per week with UEFA qualified coaches. Students are also given opportunities to gain coaching qualifications/experience and part-time employment, offering a unique pathway through Crawley Town Community Foundation. Our football team represents Crawley Town FC in the National Football Youth League and additional cup competitions, against similar programmes run by football clubs and colleges across the South of England. The Foundation Academy staff look to support all footballers to progress through pathways and opportunities into the Crawley Town FC first team squad, and other local Isthmian under-23 and first team squads, for those who excel and impress.



# Student Leadership

At HTS, we believe leadership is a journey, not just a position. Our Student Leadership Programme begins in Year 7 and develops progressively, giving every student the opportunity to apply to join a team where they will build confidence, responsibility, and the skills needed for life beyond school.

By Sixth Form, leadership reaches its pinnacle. In Year 12, students shadow our Head Team, gaining first-hand experience of the responsibilities and expectations that come with leading the school community. This mentoring stage allows them to learn, support, and prepare for the challenge of stepping into the full leadership roles in Year 13.

Our Year 13 leaders act as role models for younger students, representing the school at key public events, supporting whole-school initiatives, and helping to shape the culture of our community. In doing so, they not only give back to the school but also develop invaluable skills in communication, teamwork, decision-making, and resilience – qualities that will serve them well in higher education, employment, and beyond.

Student Leadership at HTS is about more than holding a title; it is about personal growth, responsibility, and making a positive difference.
