This course is an A Level Course.

MINIMUM SUBJECT ENTRY REQUIREMENTS (in addition to the general 6^{TH} form minimum entry requirements of 5 x grade 4 at GCSE/equivalent or above including maths and English):

GCSE grade 5 in a Science (5 4 Combined Science) or Grade 4 in GCSE Psychology and Grade 5 in Maths and English Language.

In this course you can expect to study topics including: memory, biopsychology, social influence, forensic psychology and relationships. These topics are investigated from a biological, psychological and learning point of view. You will also study the nature of science, other aspects of how psychologists conduct research and the statistical analysis of research findings.
